

AUTHORS' GUIDELINE

Abstracts are prepared as MS-Word document file (.doc) using those versions between Word 97 – 2003.

Abstracts are restricted to 2500 characters (including all materials), and is restricted to ASCII characters only.

Use **A4** size and set margins: top 35 mm, left and right 30 mm and the bottom 30 mm. Single space (normal space (1.0) between the lines) is acceptable.

All materials (text, table, and graph) must be fit within **ONE PAGE**.

All text is to be produced in a **10.5 point Century** font. Use **CAPITAL LETTERS** for the title (no longer than two lines).

List author's surname(s) preceded by initials and separated by comma, underlining the name of the presenting author. Adjust the number of the authors up to six. If needed, relate each name to the respective institution by an identification number.

List those institutions with the related number on a separated line.

List keywords (up to three) separated by comma.

Subdivide text into the following paragraphs: **Introduction, Method, Results & Discussion, Conclusion** and **References** with bold headings.

Separate title, author names, institutions, keywords and each subheading by a blank line

Either **ONE TABLE** or **ONE GRAPH** (grayscale only) is available on the abstract page, within the rectangle, and should be included in the abstract file. One table or graph approximately corresponds to 400 characters.

Use standard abbreviations, and **ONLY** use **SI** units of measurement.

Keep references to a minimum, use journal abbreviations, and do not cite the reference title.

Abstracts apparently exceed one page, lesser than half volume and far deviated from the official writing style would be a subject of **REJECTION**.
